

Convention on Supplementary Compensation for Nuclear Damage

Notes: The Convention (CSC) was adopted on 12 September 1997 and entered into force on 15 April 2015, in accordance with Article XX.1. For States depositing an instrument expressing consent to be bound after that date, the CSC enters into force on the ninetieth day after such deposit, in accordance with Article XX.2. For States depositing an instrument, or instruments, expressing consent to be bound by both the CSC and the Vienna Convention on Civil liability for Nuclear Damage (Vienna Convention) at the same time, the CSC enters into force on the ninetieth day after such States have become Parties to the Vienna Convention, in line with the requirements of Articles XVIII.1 and XIX.1 of the CSC
