Joanes Atela is Senior Research Fellow at the African Centre for Technology Studies (ACTS) in Kenya. He is an interdisciplinary scholar with more than five years' experience in research in the area of environment, climate change, agriculture and development. Mr Atela has a PhD in Environment and Development from the University of Leeds in the United Kingdom and a master's degree in Agriculture and Resource Management from the University of Bonn in Germany. His PhD research provided one of the first multilevel analyses of climate change policies from the global design process down to national and local level implementation in an African setting. Prior to joining the ACTS, Mr Atela worked at the World Agroforestry Centre as a research fellow and consultant investigating climate change policies and local livelihoods. He was also an Early Career Fellow at the Future Agricultures Consortium in affiliation with the NEPAD-Kenya Secretariat and conceptualised the NEPAD-Kenya Fellowship Programme and interventions for the Comprehensive African Agriculture Development Programme (CAADP).
