

KASIA MENDELSOHN

Ms. Mendelsohn is the Assistant Deputy Administrator for Nonproliferation and International Security (NIS), at the U.S. Department of Energy's National Nuclear Security Administration (DOE/NNSA) where she is responsible for directing the development of DOE/NNSA policies and programs to: safeguard and secure nuclear material and facilities; control the spread of weapons of mass destruction dual-use materials and technologies; develop policies and technical solutions for transparent nuclear reductions and verify compliance with international nonproliferation treaties and agreements; and develop and implement cross-cutting policies and programs to reduce nuclear dangers.

Ms. Mendelsohn has been with the Department of Energy since 1999 where she has served in a variety of capacities including as the Director of the Office of Nuclear Safeguards and Security, Director of the Office of Global Nuclear Material Threat Reduction, Deputy Director for the Global Regimes/Regional Security and Nonproliferation Policy program, and as DOE/NNSA's representative to the U.S. Biological Weapons Convention protocol negotiations. Prior to 1999, Ms. Mendelsohn worked at the U.S. Department of State in the Office of Nuclear Energy and as a defense contractor for DynCorp.
