All participants can enter this competition if they are under 35 years of age and their presentation has already been accepted for an oral or poster contribution by the technical programme committee.

Finalists will receive an award certificate as well as an IAEA souvenir handed out on the final day of the event during the award ceremony.

Terms and Conditions

1. The competition is only open to participants attending the International Conference on Accelerators for Research and Sustainable Development who present their oral or poster contribution either in person or virtually.
2. Applicants in the "Young Professional" category must be between 18 and 35 years of age.
3. Only one entry is allowed per participant.
4. All presentations must be an original work by the applicant.
