Mary Gospodarowicz is a Professor of Radiation Oncology at the University of Toronto and the Princess Margaret Cancer Centre. Her clinical research focuses on cancer trials evaluating radiation therapy, image guided precision radiotherapy and cancer survivorship.

Her current interests include global cancer control, global access to radiotherapy and quality cancer care. She has authored over 400 manuscripts and participated in the development of the WHO-IAEA Framework for setting up comprehensive cancer centres.

As past Medical Director of the Princess Margaret Cancer Centre in Toronto, the largest comprehensive cancer centre in Canada, and past Regional Vice-President of Cancer Care Ontario, Ms Gospodarowicz has gathered vast experience in cancer programme organization and delivery.

She is Past-President of the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC), spearheaded the Lancet Oncology Commission on “Expanding the global access to radiotherapy” and currently co-chairs the Lancet Commission on Cancer and Health Systems.

She is a member of the Board of Directors of the City Cancer Challenge Foundation, an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Radiologists in the United Kingdom, and has received other awards including the ASTRO Gold Medal and the Order of Canada.
