Introduction

The increasing implementation of decommissioning activities in many countries means that a significant body of knowledge is being accumulated worldwide, which is being applied to ongoing and planned future decommissioning projects. Processes for capturing and sharing of such knowledge are being developed and applied at national and at international levels. This issue is being addressed at international level by the IAEA and by other international organizations working in the field of decommissioning, including the OECD Nuclear Energy Agency and the European Commission. These organizations are actively considering options to facilitate interoperability between different knowledge management systems in the domain of decommissioning including, as an initial step, a standard taxonomy for decommissioning has been developed.

The IAEA maintains a Nuclear Wiki which serves as a knowledge platform to foster the exchange of scientific and technical information relevant to its programmatic activities concerned with the backend of the lifecycle of nuclear installations, including decommissioning. The Nuclear Wiki supplements other electronic media used by the IAEA for knowledge capture and sharing, such as published reports, e-Learning materials, the IAEA's International Nuclear Information System (INIS) and online databases.

The European Commission Joint Research Centre (EC-JRC) has been charged by the European Parliament and the European Council with development of a decommissioning knowledge management system, with the aim of ensuring that expertise arising from ongoing decommissioning programmes is gathered, retained and disseminated to support the future industrial decommissioning projects in the European Union. This system is currently under development.

Objectives

The purpose of the event is to discuss good practices in the management of knowledge to support the decommissioning of nuclear facilities. The interoperability of knowledge systems will be promoted by sharing with the IAEA Member States the proposed standard taxonomy for decommissioning, based on simple knowledge organization system principles, recently developed jointly by the IAEA, the Nuclear Energy Agency of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development and the European Commission's Joint Research Centre.

Presentations and discussions at the event will address in particular:

- Current approaches to organization of knowledge to support the planning and implementation of decommissioning projects.
- The emerging role of digital technologies in facilitating data management for decommissioning.
- Facilitating improved access to experience gained from ongoing decommissioning projects

In addition to discussions on current good practice in Member State decommissioning programmes, the meeting will include discussion on the current status and future evolution of the knowledge management systems relevant to decommissioning being maintained by IAEA and the EC-JRC, including the IAEA's Nuclear Wiki and associated online databases containing decommissioning-relevant information, together with the knowledge centre under development by the EC-JRC.

Managers and knowledge management specialists from organizations with responsibilities in the domain of nuclear decommissioning.

The event will be held at the Ispra offices of the European Commission's Joint Research Centre. Participants must make their own travel and accommodation arrangements.
