> VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE GENERAL FUND IN 1960

Report of the Committee for Pledges of Voluntary Contributions to the General Fund

Rapportour: Mr. A. Crevette (Monaco)

1. At its twenty-sixth plenary meeting the General Conference established a Committee of the whole Conference under the chairmanship of the President of the General Conference for the purpose of receiving announcements of pledges of voluntary contributions of money to the General Fund for  $1960^{1/2}$ .

2. The Committee met on 1 October 1959, and unanimously elected Mr. A. Crevette (Monaco) Vice-Chairman and Rapporteur.

3. Delegates from 24 Member States announced that their Governments would make voluntary financial contributions to the General Fund. Full details of these pledges are given in the table which follows. It was indicated that a number of pledges were subject to the approval of the legislative authorities of the Governments concerned. In order to ensure that these and other reservations were fully recorded, the Committee decided that a verbatim record of its proceedings should be issued.

4. The delegate from the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics stated that his Government would favourably consider making a fresh contribution to the General Fund when the previous contribution of 500 000 Roubles for the purchase by Member States of equipment and material in the Soviet Union had been used by the Agency.

5. At the conclusion of its meeting the Committee unanimously decided to recommend to the General Conference the adoption of the following draft resolution:

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE GENERAL FUND IN 1960

## The General Conference

1. <u>Takes note</u> of the report of the Committee for Pledges of Voluntary Contributions to the General Fund;

2. <u>Expresses</u> its appreciation to those Member States which have pledged voluntary contributions to the General Fund in 1960, noting that certain of these pledges are subject to legislative decision by the authorities concerned; and

3. <u>Requests</u> the Director General to inform Member States from time to time of the additional pledges notified to him after the end of the third regular session.
