SCALE OF MEMBERS' CONTRIBUTIONS FOR 1965

Memorandum by the Director General

- 1. The Director General submits herewith, for the consideration of the General Conference, a draft resolution containing the proposed scale for assessment of Members' contributions to the Agency's Regular Budget for 1965. Pursuant to the recommendation made by the General Conference at its second regular session [1] the Agency's scales for assessment are based on the United Nations scale for the preceding calendar year.
- 2. The proposed scale is calculated to take account of the membership of the Agency on 31 August 1964. The addition of six new Members, i.e. Algeria, Cameroun, Gabon, Ivory Coast, Libya and Nigeria, results in reductions in the assessments for some Member States. An explanation of the numerical data used in calculating the scale is given in the Annex to the present document. The procedure for calculating the contribution of any State that becomes a Member of the Agency after the scale for 1965 has been adopted is set out in the second paragraph of the draft resolution.

B. Method for calculating the coefficient 0.920

- 1. In the United Nations scale for 1962, 1963 and 1964, the assessments of Members of the Agency that are also Members of the United Nations amount to 98.97% of the total. The assessments recommended by the United Nations for the Agency's Members that are not Members of the United Nations amount to 7.08%, making a grand total of 106.05% (see columns 2 and 3 of section A above).
- 2. It is therefore necessary to find a coefficient by which to multiply the above-mentioned assessments of Members of the Agency so as to decrease the total to 100.00%. In calculating this coefficient the following considerations were taken into account:
 - (a) The percentage contribution of the United States of America in the Agency's scale for 1964 was set at a maximum of 31.93%. In accordance with the decision of the General Conference [3] the coefficient has not been applied to the United Nations percentage of the highest contributor. However, in the Agency's scale for 1964, its percentage has been reduced by applying to it a proportionate share in the percentages of new Members which have joined the Agency. This has resulted in a new percentage rate of 31.84 for the highest contributor without increasing the percentage of any other Member State; this figure still represents the highest rate of assessment of any Member on a per capita basis; and
 - (b) The percentages of the following Member States are fixed at a minimum level of 0.04 in both the United Nations and the Agency's scales:
