CREDENTIALS OF DELEGATES TO THE THIRTEENTH REGULAR SESSION

(b) REPORT OF THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

Chairman: Ambassador Hortencio I. BRILLANTES (Philippines)

1. The Credentials Committee¹/ met on 26 September, when Ambassador Hortencio I. Brillantes of the Philippines was unanimously elected Chairman.

2. The delegate of Poland stated that his Government "refused to recognize the validity of credentials issued by the Chiang Kai-shek regime and by Saigon/South Viet-Nam".

3. The delegate of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics emphasized that "his Government was unable to accept the validity of the credentials of the Saigon Administration/South Viet-Nam". In addition he mentioned that "his Government found it quite intolerable that the German Democratic Republic was not given the opportunity of becoming a Member State of the Agency".

4. The delegate of the United States of America, in referring to the issue of China's representation, proposed that the Committee recommend that the Conference adopt the draft resolution I which is reproduced at the end of this report. He declared that it was desirable that the Conference, by adopting the draft resolution, follow the procedure adopted by the Agency year after year, and the precedents set by the General Assembly and by other international organizations.

5. The delegates of the Philippines, Thailand and Spain supported the views presented by the delegate of the United States.

6. The Committee accepted the United States proposal by seven votes to two.

7. The delegate of the United States of America then added that his Government could not agree to the remarks made by the delegates from Poland and from the Soviet Union, concerning the credentials of South Viet-Nam.

8. The Committee found that credentials satisfying the provisions of Rule 27 of the Rules of Procedure had been submitted to the Director General for the delegates of the following 68 Member States:

9. The Committee found that the credentials submitted for the delegates of the following five Member States did not satisfy the provisions of Rule 27:

The consensus was, however, that in accordance with the practice of the Agency, of the United Nations and of other international organizations, these credentials should be accepted as provisional, on the understanding that satisfactory credentials for them would be submitted as soon as possible.

10. The Committee was informed that by the time of its meeting no credentials in respect of the delegates of the following six Member States had been received by the Director General:

The Committee was nevertheless of the opinion that these delegates should be provisionally seated with the same rights as other delegates, pending the submission of their credentials.

11. The Committee noted that the following 23 Member States were not represented at the session:

12. The Committee recommends that the Conference adopt the following two resolutions:

CREDENTIALS OF DELEGATES TO THE THIRTEENTH REGULAR SESSION OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE

The General Conference,

(a) <u>Recalling</u> the recommendation of the fifth regular session of the General Assembly of the United Nations on 14 December 1950 that "the attitude adopted. by the General Assembly" regarding the representation of a Member State "should be taken into account in other organs of the United Nations and in the specialized agencies"*/, and

(b) <u>Recalling also</u> the action which the General Assembly took on 19 November 1968 regarding the representation of China $\frac{**/}{}$,

1. Decides to take no action on any proposal to change the representation of China at its thirteenth regular session; and

2. Finds that the credentials of the delegate of the Government of the Republic of China conform with the provisions of Rule 27 of the Rules of Procedure.
