CREDENTIALS OF DELEGATES TO THE FIFTEENTH REGULAR SESSION

(b) REPORT OF THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

Chairman: Admiral Oscar A. QUIHILLALT (Argentina)

- 1. The Credentials Committee met on 23 September 1971, when Admiral Oscar A. Quihillalt of Argentina was unanimously elected Chairman.
- 2. The delegate of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics stated that his Government "could not recognize as valid the credentials of the Saigon Administration, which had no right to represent South Viet-Nam at this General Conference".
- 3. The delegate of Poland stated that his delegation wished to associate itself with the reservation made by the delegate of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.
- 4. The Committee found that credentials satisfying the provisions of Rule 27 of the Rules of Procedure had been submitted to the Director General for the delegates of the following 66 Member States:

5. The Committee found that credentials submitted for the delegates of the following nine Member States did not satisfy the provisions of Rule 27:

The consensus was, however, that in accordance with the practice of the Agency, of the United Nations and of other international organizations, these credentials should be accepted as provisional, on the understanding that satisfactory credentials for them would be submitted as soon as possible.

6. The Committee was informed that by the time of its meeting no credentials in respect of the delegates of the following nine Member States had been received by the Director General:

The Committee was nevertheless of the opinion that these delegates should be provisionally seated with the same rights as other delegates, pending the submission of their credentials.

## REPORT OF THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

## The General Conference

Approves the report of the Credentials Committee set forth in document GC(XV)/473.

The Soviet delegate records that "while supporting the above draft resolution it votes against the recognition of the credentials of the delegate of the Saigon Administration and of the delegate of Taiwan". The Polish delegate associates himself with the position taken by the Soviet delegate.
